Consumers, the insured and patients need health literacy - Health Literacy. Only then can they act as equal partners with health professionals, bring in their perspectives, needs and wishes and make independent health decisions.

The current Health Literacy study on eight EU countries (HLS-EU) shows that about 56 percent of Austrians have inadequate health literacy (Ludwig Boltzmann Institute

2012). Thus, Austria is among the eight countries examined in the study (Bulgaria, Germany, Greece, Ireland, the Netherlands, Poland, Spain, Austria), penultimate to Bulgaria.
